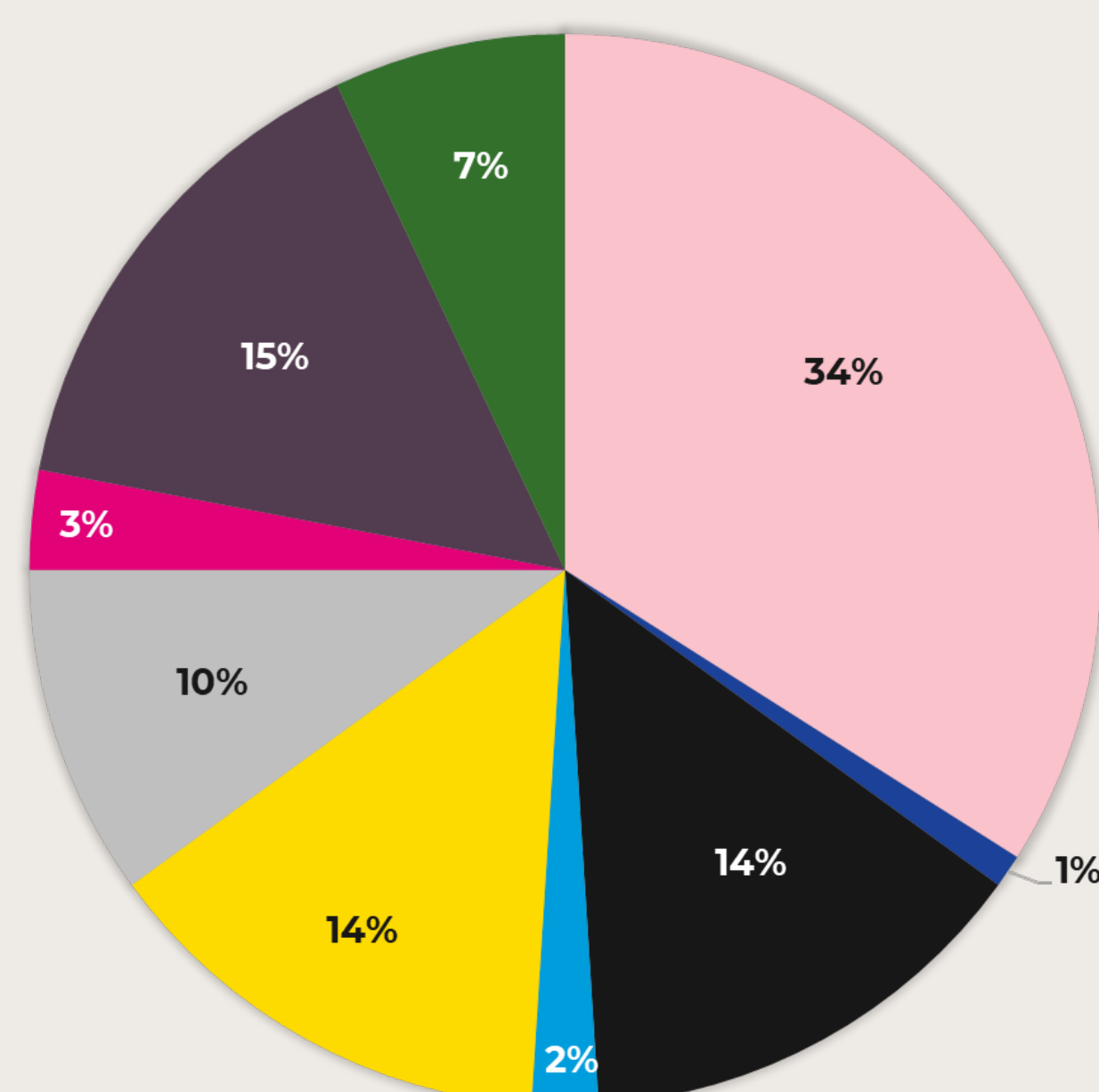

DETERMINATION PROPORTIONS

- Attribute:** Product characteristics
- Use:** Reviewers' advice on how to use product
- Side Effects:** Intended or unintended effect (excludes "no side effects")
- Value:** Efficacy, price, worth, or usefulness
- Adherence:** Reviewers who stopped taking it
- Condition:** Disease state and its impact
- Cross Product:** Other products used & efficacy
- Doctor:** Interactions with a provider
- Neutral:** Dose, encouragement, questions



01 Pharmacovigilance & Ethics

Data are anonymous, complicating the AE/SE reporting without explicit policies
 IRB may deem as research not involving human subjects

02 Data Extraction & Cleaning

Custom web scraper can extract all text, demographics, star ratings, & dates into a relational SQL database
 Clean text of cases, special characters, emojis, contractions and typos

03 Tokenization & Determinations

Word-, sentence-, and review-level tokens provide different levels of analysis
 Reviews that contain multiple topics need to be parsed out to determine the topical theme (see left)

04 Compare & Validate SA Packages

SA packages use different lexicons & scoring algorithms. Consider building a lexicon for a disease state of interest
 Validate scores with a human review

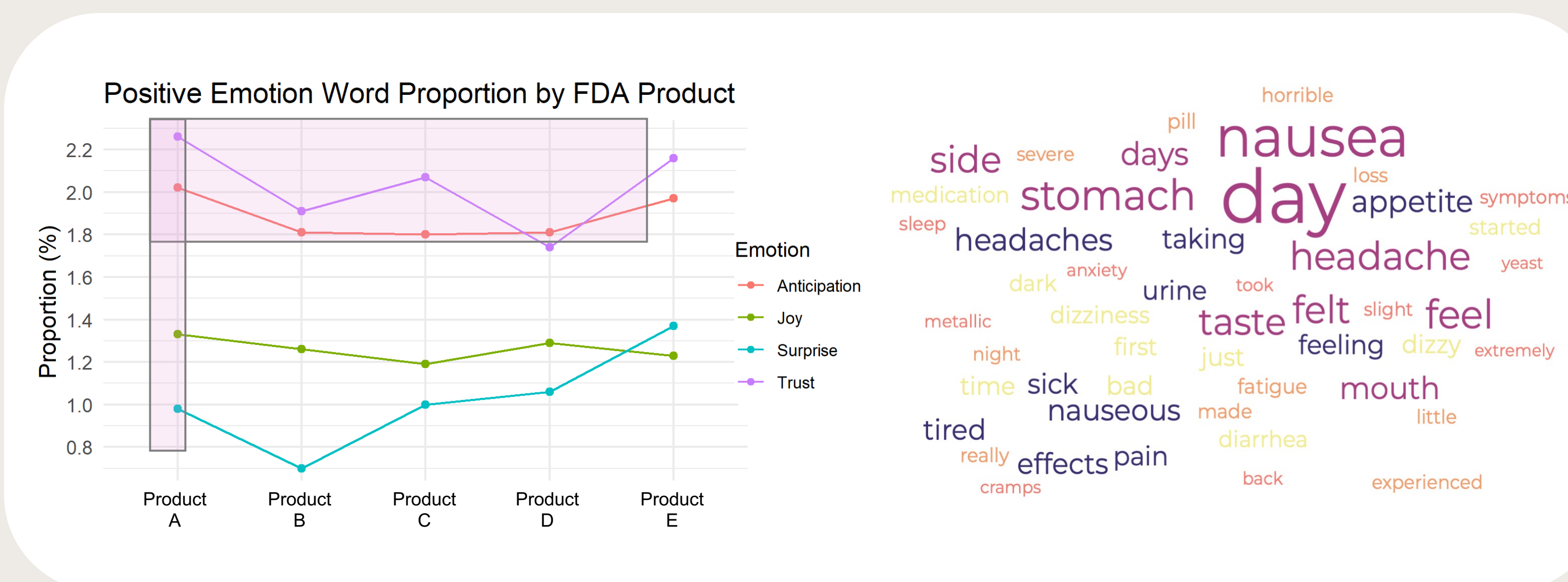
05 Quantitative Analyses

Use reviewer attributes, start ratings, and SA scores to test hypotheses
 Line graphs, bar charts, and word clouds provide additional details to make product comparisons (see below)

06 Qualitative Analyses

Themes can be summarized using qualitative description for a rich, straight description of an experience without the imposition of a theoretical or interpretative lens
