n behalf of the ISPOR Student Network, it is a pleasure to welcome new and returning ISPOR student members to the 2015-2016 academic year. In collaboration with the current Student Network Chair, Elisabeth Oehrlein from the University of Maryland, and the past Student Network Chair, Brendan Kelly from Touro University, we will provide an introduction to the Student Network, highlight the accomplishments of last years' ISPOR Student Network and introduce upcoming Student Network activities.

With more than 1,300 student members, the ISPOR Student Network has 75 active student chapters located on five continents (see Fig. 1). Individual chapters promote educational activities on the local level and are represented within the larger Student Network by their chapter President. The chapter president attends monthly Student Network teleconferences with other representatives and has the opportunity to participate in a Student Network Committee. These committees work on behalf of all ISPOR Student members to provide educational resources and networking opportunities.

The Education Committee hosted monthly webinars featuring topics of interest to the student body, including Medical Informatics, Patient Centered Outcomes Research, and case studies in cost effectiveness [1]. The Newsletter Committee prepared newsletters

highlighting the achievements of student chapters and Network committees [2]. The Meeting Planning Committee assisted in organizing student activities at both the European Congress held in Amsterdam, Netherlands as well as the Annual International Meeting held in Philadelphia, PA, USA. The Membership Outreach Committee helped initiate ten new chapters in eight countries. The Survey Committee administered the Student Interest Survey to elicit members' interests in Student Network activities to direct the planning of Student Network goals for the coming year [3]. The Public Relations Committee launched a webinar format for the monthly teleconferences. The University of Toledo designed last years' winning t-shirt. The Webmaster Committee worked with individual committees and chapters to keep the Student Network website up to date.


The Annual Student Research Showcase held during the Annual International Meeting in Philadelphia, highlighted student research focusing on "Integrating Big Data, Patient Data, and Cost-Effectiveness into Clinical Practice." Presenters included Vardhaman Patel, MS, University of Illinois at Chicago; Ruchitbhai M Shah, MS, University of Mississippi; Jana Bartakova, MSc, Charles University in Prague; and Xiao (Angeline) Cheng, PharmD, MSc, City University London [4].

The Student Network recognized four outstanding chapters for

their chapter's achievements over the past year: University of Maryland, West Virginia University, Hacettepe University, and University of Toledo.

The Research Competition was the largest in the Student Network's history, with 19 schools participating. The winners of the highly attended Research Competition were 1stplace The University of Texas at Austin; 2nd place Virginia Commonwealth University: and 3rd place Mercer University.

ISPOR recognized six students for their outstanding podium and poster research presentations during the Annual International Meeting (see Table). Student podium awardees include Kai Yeung from the University of Washington, Geannan Camponeschi from the Johns Hopkins University, and Joseph F. Levy from University of

We would like to acknowledge and thank our ISPOR Student Network Liaison, Jennifer Casillas, without whom the Student Network Activities would not be possible. With her and other ISPOR staff's support, this coming year we hope to provide more opportunities for students to **connect** and **collaborate**. The Survey Committee is currently drafting a new survey on "Student-Recognized Opportunities for Improvement to Outcomes Research Curriculum," while the **Education Committee** is designing an online course, which would be available to students for a certificate of completion. The **Newsletter Committee** has already published their quarterly newsletter for summer 2015, highlighting the activities of Student Chapters across the globe.

Congratulations to all student members for their achievements this past year! We look forward to a great academic year ahead and all the successes it will include!
