Beginning in 2011, ISPOR began presenting the *Value in Health* Paper of the Year Award. The award marks the establishment of the Society's journal as one of the most widely cited in the field of health services research.

We are pleased to announce Sabine E. Grimm, PhD as the recipient of this year's award. Her paper, *When Future Change Matters: Modeling Future Price and Diffusion in Health Technology Assessments of Medical Devices,* addresses the impact of diffusion and changes in prices on health technology assessments of devices and other medical technologies. The article builds on prior work that has looked at the theory of diffusion of innovations and dynamic modeling of incremental cost-effectiveness ratios. It also addresses two-part modeling, where the first part reflects the coverage and reimbursement decision and the second part looks at uptake based on experience.

n 2015, *Value in Health Regional Issues* began presenting the *Value in Health Regional Issues* Excellent Article Award in each of its three main regions: Asia, Latin America, and Central & Eastern Europe, Western Asia, and Africa.

The recipient of this year's award is Aleš Tichopád, PhD (Kantar Health s.r.o., Prague, Czech Republic) for his paper entitled, *Cost Burden of Severe Community-Acquired Rotavirus Gastroenteritis Requiring Hospitalization in the Czech Republic, Slovakia, Poland, and Hungary: A Retrospective Patient Chart Review.*

This study presents a retrospective patient chart review of children with severe community-acquired rotavirus gastroenteritis (RVGE) requiring hospitalization. The study was conducted in parallel in four European countries (Czech Republic, Slovakia, Poland, and Hungary). It is one of the very few studies that estimates the costs associated with the treatment of RVGE, and provides robust data to inform economic evaluations of rotavirus vaccination in these countries.
