The ISPOR 19th Annual European Congress in Vienna, Austria was attended by more than 380 students. To facilitate interaction, communications, and learning from one another, the ISPOR Student Network hosted a variety of events for students and new professionals, including the Student Research Showcase, Student Welcome Reception, and Faculty & Student Luncheon. The International Student Planning Meeting Committee was represented at all the student-oriented events that were held during the European Congress in Vienna.

Student Research Showcase and Poster Sessions

The Student Research Showcase featured four outcome research studies, presented by ISPOR student members. Amr Makady, **MSc** (The National Healthcare Institute) presented "The Implementation of CRS in HTA Practice-Experiences from The Netherlands;" Bettina Wulff Risør, MPH, PhD (University of Southern Denmark) and Frank Moriarty, HRB PhD (Royal College of Surgeons in Ireland) analysed. "The Economic Impact of Potentially Inappropriate Prescribing in Older People in Ireland Using a Markov Modelling Approach;" and Gerrit L. Merkens, BSc (Utrecht University) presented "Diversity in Economic Evaluations Hampers Valid Treatment Decision Making in Metastatic Colorectal Cancer." They presented a brief summary of their research study and final conclusions, followed by

a discussion on "Having a High Impact on Managing Access to Medical Innovation: Strengthening The Methodology-Policy Nexus." These presentations showed the eagerness of the young researchers for innovative ways to make a difference in various areas of health economic evaluation.

ISPOR Vienna European Congress offered many students the opportunity to present their research through poster presentations and concluded with awards for Best Student Poster Research Presentation. Recipients were: Frédérique Cornélie Wilhelmina van Krugten for "Feasibility, Reliability and Validity of the Decision Tool Unipolar Depression in Indentifying Patients with Massive Depression Disorder in Need of Highly Specialized Care," Katarzyna Orlewska for "Cost of Lost Productivity Due to Premature, Suicide-Related Mortality in Poland," and Saara Huoponen for "A Cost-effectiveness Analysis of Abatacept, Tocilizumab, and TNF-inhibitor Compared with Ritixumab as a Second-line Therapy for Treatment of Rheumatoid Arthritis."
