## **ISPOR 6th Asia HTA Roundtable**

### ***HTA New Developments in Asia***

25-26 September, 2015

Astana Medical University Conference Center

Astana, Kazakhstan

### Summary

The HTA roundtable, “*HTA New Developments in Asia*,” hosted over 30 participants from Australia, India, Indonesia, Japan, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mainland China, Malaysia, Philippines, Russia, South Korea, Taiwan, Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and EUnetHTA, as well as welcome remarks from the Vice Rector’s office of Astana Medical University.

The 1.5 day roundtable presentations covered the following topics: 1) Updates on HTA utilization in the policy making in Asia. 2) HTA awareness in CIS Countries (Commonwealth of Independent States). 3) Discussion on economic evaluation of complementary and alternative medicine (CAM). There was robust discussion among the delegates on HTA issues such as cost effectiveness threshold determination, private public partnerships and governance.

The roundtable discussion was summarized in three points: 1) the key to truly effective HTA development will be continual capacity building - that is, an ongoing investment in the future generation of HTA leaders, 2) a determined and consistent effort of engagement and cooperation between countries and all stakeholders and 3) establishing a governance system that supports a sustainable and inclusive environment for each country.
